was proved at London with a Codicil the sixteenth Day of February in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and sixty seven before the Worshipful Arthur Collier Doctor of Laws and Surrogate of the Right Worshipful George Day also Doctor of Laws Master Wrepper or Commissary of the Prerogative Court of Canterbury lawfully constituted by the Oathes of Thomas Esquire the Brother of the deceased Charles Palmer Esquire and William Leigh the Executors named in the said Will to whom Administration was granted of all and singular the Goods Chattels and Credits of the said deceased having been first sworn duly to administer.

# London Translation

On this Day the tenth Day the 10<sup>th</sup> of June of this instant Year 1765 appeared before me Adernardus Schuytman Notary public created by the Court of Utrecht and sworn and permitted by the Worshipful Burgomasters and Council of the said City to Execution thereof residing in Utrecht and the aforementioned witnesses Mr. Pieter Van Waal and Medicine Doctor dwelling in this City known to me Notary who signifying to have some Effects in England and Great Britain has by these presents appointed and ordained Mr. Hendrik Van Dam also Notary of the said Court his sole Executor and Administrator of all such Effects as he at his Death might have in the said Kingdom of England and Great Britain giving to him full power and Authority immediately after his the said Deceased's Death to govern administer to sell and to transferr all the said Effects now excepted before the Shroffs and to give acquittances for the same as the said Deceased desiring that after his Death on these letters of Administration be granted in Common form. Thus Done Signed and Sealed in Utrecht in the presence of the undersigned witnesses on the Day Month and Year as above. The sole Executor named in the said Will as to the Goods Chattels and Credits of the said deceased lying and being in the Kingdom of England and Great Britain to whom Administration was granted for the purposes aforesaid but no further or otherwise he having been first sworn by Commission duly to administer.

I Francis Vincent of Bodington in the County of Warwick Esq. this being the 30th Day of October 1765 finding myself sound in Mind and of perfect Memory though infirm in Body do make and declare this to be my last Will and Testament first with all due Resignation I commend my Soul to God in full Confidence that he will of his Mercy accept of my Repentance and through the Merits and Mediation of Jesus Christ my Redeemer forgive all my Sins Negligences and Quarances In the next Place I leave my Body to be decently buried at the Discretion of my Executors As to my worldly Goods I dispose of them in the following manner following my just Debts Trusts and funeral Expenses being first duly discharged I give bequeath and devise unto my dear Wife Mary whom I hereby declare to be my sole Executrix All my Estates in Lands or Houses wheresoever lying and being with all my Store Money Securities Goods and Chattels wheresoever I may dye possessed for her use and Benefit during the Term of her Life and then I will that all my real Estate in Lands and Tenements shall go to my dear Son Thomas Vincent and that my said Executrix do dispose of by Gift or her last Will of all my personal Estate between my said Son and my Daughters as she shall think proper and in such portions as they by their dutiful Carriage towards her and Behaviour may merit
