In the name of God Amen The
Thirtieth daie of October. In the year of our Lord God one thousand six
hundred sixty seven. I Humfrey Adderley of Wotton in the County of Warwick
Esquire being weak in body but of perfect mind and memory doe make and ordaine
by my last will and testament in manner and forme followinge. First I bequeath
my soule into the hande of God and my body to the earth from whence it
came. And as concerning my state and worldly goodes first unto my loving wife
Jane Adderley I give and bequeath the one halfe of all my household goodes and of
my stocke upon my ground and all my tottage and my two shopes fronting
belonging now in the towne or occupation of John Wactram lying in higam in
the Countie of Leicesters. Item to my eldest sonne Humfrey Adderley I give and
bequeath the one halfe of my plate. Item to my other sonne John Adderley I give and
bequeath all my land lying in the Lordshipp of Nubaton to him and his heires for ever
Item to my eldest daughter Elizabeth the wife of William Jacome of Poath in the
Countie of Leicesters Esquire I give and bequeath twenty nobles to buy her a Knight. Item
to my second daughter Mary the wife of John Pike I give and bequeath five hundred
pounds to be put into the hande of my some wine for the use of her and her children
and not to be disposed of but with the consent of my Executors. And I give twenty
pounds a peece to her two children Humfrey and Jane to be disposed of for their
benefitt by my Executors. Item to my third daughter Katourin the wife of Richard
Wine Clarke I give and bequeath three hundred pounds to be paid to the said
Richard Wine the eight and twentieth day of February next coming besides the
twenty pounds I owe him. Item to my fourth daughter Debora the wife of
George Manton I give and bequeath fifty pounds to be paid within one yeare
next after my decease. Item to my fifth daughter Jane Adderley I give and
bequeath three hundred pounds to be paid within one yeare after my decease.
Item to my sixth daughter Anna Adderley I give and bequeath three hundred
pounds to be paid within one yeare after my decease. Item to my youngest
daughter Abigail Adderley I give and bequeath three hundred pounds to be
paid within one yeare after my decease. Item I give and bequeath by this my last
will and testament to my loving friends Sir Harvie Bagott Barouett,
William Purofoy of Calcott in the Countie of Warwick Esquire John Adderley
of Monks in the Countie of Midd. Esq. and my Brother in law Henry Ward
Citizen of London and to their heires and assigns forever all and singular my
Lordshipp Lande tenem. and hereditaments whatsover within the realme
of England and not formerly disposed of by this my will. And all my goodes (hathel and
cattel) whatsover and not formerly disposed of by this my will upon trust
and confidence, and to the ends and purposes that they may be able to pay
either by sale of all or part of my said Lande and goodes or otherwise to raise and
make sure sommes of money as shall discharge and pay all my debts whatsover
and portons and legacys in this my will given and bequeathed. Provided alwaies
that if my eldest sonne Humfrey Adderley shall tender and give sure sufficient
for my debts within one yeare next after my decease to my above named loving
friends Sir Harvie Bagott William Purofoy John Adderley and Henry Ward
as they in their discretion shall judge and finde sufficient for the satisfaction of my
debts legacys and portons formerly mentioned in this my will that then my will an

in witness

meaninge is that my said Sonne Humphrey Alderley immediately hereupon shall have reassured
to give by and from all and every of my said lawfull friends Sir Harvie Bagott William
Pursey John Alderley and Henry Waide. All my said lands lordships tenements and
hereditaments formerly mentioned and not disposed of by this my will, and all my good
wattles and rattles not formerly in this my will given and bequeathed, And I name and
appoint my said wellbelovéd friends Sir Harvie Bagott, William Pursey, John
Alderley and Henry Waide to be exorsors of this my last will and testament, And if it
shall happen at any time hereafter my doubt or question doe growe or arise by
reason of imperfection or defect of or in the words and clause and contents in this my
last will and testament, or of my true intent and meaninge herein, that then I
will that my said exorsors shall expounde explaine and interpret such doubt or question
according to their wisdome and discretion And I doe publish and declare this for my
last will and testament and give in witnes therof hereunto subscribed my name and
affixed my seale the day and yeare above written. In witness whereof I have signed

The ffowerth day of January In the thirtenth yeare of the raigne of
our soveraigne Lord shoulde by the grace of God King of England
Scotland France and Ireland Defendor of the faith etc Richard
Maier of ffower in the Countie of Kentwell Merchant born of sound and
perfect memorie (thanked bee to God) and now bounde to God doe make
ordaine this my last will and testament in manner and forme followinge as
followeth hereby set in words and deed all former wills and devises by mee
heretofore made revoketh first I commend my soule into the hands of Almighty
God my Maker, and to Jesus Christ my onely Saviour and Redeemer by whose
death and passion I hope to have free pardon and remission of all my sinnes and
offences. Item I give and bequeath to Phillip Maier my Sonne All that my
messuages or tenement and garden with the appurtenances commonly called or knowne
by the name of Sweetlands house situate lying and being in ffower aforesaid
to have and to hold the same unto the said Phillip my Sonne for and during all
such time terme, and number of yeares as are yett to come and unexpired of
and in the same. Also I give and bequeath unto the said Phillip my Sonne some some
pounds of lawfull money of England to be paid unto him when hee shall be
lawfull age of twenty and one yeares or bee married. Item I give and
bequeath to Peter Maier my Sonne All that my tenement house and garden
with the appurtenances wherof I now dwell in ffower aforesaid, to have and to hold
the same unto the said Peter Maier his exorsors and assignes for and duringe
all such time terme and number of yeares as are yett to come and unexpired
