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and declares thys worded or like in effecte viz: wherab I have bestowed my daughter  
Anne in marriage and have given with her in aduancemente soe much as  
is sufficiente for her portion of all my goodes and Landes, I doe therefore revoke  
and make voyde my whole Legacy and bequest sett downe to her in my will saving  
I leave her one Cam of silver and gyllt and ten payre of sheetes as is sett  
downe in my will beinge presente and hearinge the same Charles Hales, Hamon  
Cranforde and Stephen Hales; And the premises beinge spoken uttered  
testified to effecte the same did strike owte or cause to be striken owte one Legacy  
of fforty hundreth poundes bequathed to his sayde daughter Anne in his will.  
And in steede thereof did give Legacy to his daughter Katheryn as is sett  
downe in the same will, And did give order unto the saide Charles Hales in  
like manner to strike owte the name and gyfte of his saide daughter Anne in all  
other places of his saide will, which the saide Charles Hales executed by  
negligence or for wante of convenient tyme omitted and deferred soe that  
before the same tyme be altered accordyng to the true meaninge of the saide  
testator he departed this life: And therefore the testator hym self  
a little before his death, to manifeste this Codicill and to declare his further  
meaninge touching the alteration of his saide former will, made also one  
other Codicill in writtynge vnder his hande and scale as hereafter followeth  
viz: **Whereas**, before this tyme I have made and declared my will and  
testament in writtynge vnder my hande and scale wherby, and by some other  
conveyance I have committed my Landes and disposed my goodes as by the same  
appeareth. And forasmuch as by reason of the sale of my woodes and the  
alteration of some other thinges which are happened since the makinge of

by the rationes aforesaide it is requisite and most needfull, therefore my  
mynde and will is vpon speciall trust and confidence reposed in Sir John  
Harrington knight and Thomas Stone Clarke not onely by conveyance  
but also by my saide will they are to have and receive some profitte of  
my saide Landes and goodes onely for the preferment of my daughter Anne  
and Katheryn in regarde my daughter Anne is already preferred with a  
convenient portion: That nowe yt woulde please them the sayde Sir John and  
Thomas Stone, and if assuredly hope they will most willingly be contented  
not onely to resigne the and leave of to deale in the same trust as my minde  
is nowe, they shoulde; But also that the sayde Sir John will likewise redde  
vpon one lease to hym made of my saide woodes, the choice consideration thereof  
beinge already offered, for which truste and to the ende and purpose of  
might settle the same accordyng to my nowe mynde I doe hereby revok  
all such trust and authority as to them or either of them, I have any  
waye given or committed; And for greafe and speciall consideration do committe  
the same unto Elizabeth my wyffe and Humphrey my sonne whom I make and  
constitute my full and whole executor of my last will and testament wherof  
I doe appoynte and make this a speciall parte allowed for so much that  
my saide daughter Anne and Katheryn be as largely preferred as by my saide last  
will and testament is mente and intended desyringe the sayde Sir John and  
Thomas Stone to become overseers of this my last will and testament.  
Wherby beinge in perfect remembrance prayed be God have declared some  
speciall poynts of my mynde and will; And for there paynted to be here taken  
I gave to dyther of them one Collyer to be taken of such as I nowe have willed  
my executor to sett the same to them desyred accordyngly; In witness wherof

I have hereunto putte my hand and seale the sixte daye of March, in the fortyeth yere of the  
 Reigne of our soveraigne Ladye Elizabeth, by the grace of God Queene of England &
