George Goring of Fleet Street in the City of London, Clerk to the Court of Probate and Prerogative Court and was called that they know and well acquainted with John Carey late of Gray's Inn, Clerk to the Court of Probate and of the Court of Prerogative in the City of London, Attorney at Law and also with his inance and executor of said Goring and subscription having frequently seen him write and write and subscribe his name and having now particularly viewed and perused the paper containing a certificate as to the purporting to be and contain the last will and testament of the said deceased and beginning thus "This is the last will and testament of me John Carey of the Court of Probate London" signing the same by me the said Henry Butler the day of September in the year of our Lord our thousand eight hundred and thirty six and thus subscribed "J. that is to say I give devise and bequeath unto my dear wife Sophia Place for her executor administrators and assigns all my in her right lands tenements and hereditaments estate and effects real personal and moveable and of what nature kind or quality soever real as well as personal to and for her own proper use and benefit in case she shall survive me. And if she shall die in my life time then I give devise and bequeath by my said wife's lands tenements and hereditaments estate and effects real as well as personal unto my three children William Henry Place Sophia Place and Lionel Place their executors administrators and assigns to be equally divided between them as tenants in common and not as joint tenants and I do appoint my said wife sole executrix of this my will and hereby revoke all wills testaments and dispositions by me at any time heretofore made.
