9. ELIZABETH DE BEAUCHAMP, married before 1336/7 (as his 2nd wife) THOMAS DE ASTLEY (or ASTELEY), Knt., of Astley, Bentley, and Weddington, Warwickshire, Broughton, Leicestershire, and Crick, Northamptonshire, son and heir of Giles de Astley, Knt., by Alice, 2nd daughter and co-heiress of Thomas de Wolvey, Knt., of Wolvey, Warwickshire. He was born in or before 1305. They had three sons, William, Knt., Thomas, Knt., and Giles. He was married previously to MARGARET ______, who was living 15 July 1334. They had no known issue. He was heir in 1325 to his uncle, Nicholas de Astley, 2nd Lord Astley. In 1338 he founded a chantry in Astley, Warwickshire, which, in 1343, he had sanction to change into a collegiate church. He was summoned to Parliament from 25 Feb. 1342/3 to 10 March 1349/50. SIR THOMAS DE ASTLEY, 3nd Lord Astley, was living 3 May 1366.

WILLIAM ASTLEY (or ASTELEY), 4th Lord Astley, of Astley, Bentley, and Weddington, Warwickshire, justice of the peace for Warwickshire, son and heir, born before 1345. He married (1th) before 1370 JOAN (or ?KATHERINE) WILLOUGHBY, daughter of John de Willoughby, 3th Lord Willoughby of Eresby, by Cecily, daughter of Robert de Ufford, Knt., K.G., 1th Earl of Suffolk. They had one daughter, Joan. He was never summoned to Parliament. In 1370 he had license for an oratory in his manor at Weddington.
 Warwickshire, which license was renewed in 1371. In 1389 he granted a rent charge of 40s. on his manor of Bentley, Warwickshire to the collegiate church of Astley, Warwickshire. Sometime in the period, 1384/5–1402/3, he acquired the manors of Alcott (in Coleshill) and Bedworth, Warwickshire from John Charnels, Esq., or his heirs. His wife, Joan, was evidently living in 1404. He married (2th) before 1413/4 MARGARET ________ They had no issue. WILLIAM DE ASTLEY, 4th Lord Astley, died in 1420. His widow, Margaret, was living in 1434/5. T.C. 10. THOMAS DE ASTLEY, Knt., of Hillmorton, Warwickshire, and, in right of his wife, of Braunstone (in Glenfield) and Little Stretton, Leicestershire, younger son. He married before 12 Dec. 1369 ELIZABETH DE HARCOURT, daughter and heiress of Richard de Harcourt, Knt., of Ellenhall, Staffordshire, by Joan, daughter of William de Shareshill, Knt., Chief Justice of the King's Bench. She was born about 1347/9 (aged 22 in 1369 and 21 in 1370). They had two sons, Thomas, Esq., and John, and one daughter, Elizabeth, wife of John Clay, Knt. They were involved in a protracted series of lawsuits regarding the manor of Ellenhall, the reversion of which was awarded to them. She was living in 1383–84. SIR THOMAS DE ASTLEY died in 1399.

11. THOMAS ASTLEY, Esq., of Ellenhall, Staffordshire, son and heir, born say 1385. He married before 18 Jan. 1423/4 JOAN GRESLEY, daughter of Thomas Gresley, Knt., by Margaret, daughter of Thomas Walsh. In 1424 she was granted an annuity of £40 as King Henry VI's former nurse. They had five sons, Thomas, Esq., John, William, Richard, and Henry. He was ejected from Ellenhall by his cousin, Robert Harcourt. THOMAS ASTLEY, Esq., died before 13 Jan. 1432, when his widow, Joan, sued Robert Harcourt for dower. In 1446 she founded the gild of Holy Trinity and a chantry in St. Botolph without Aldersgate, London. She was living in 1463 when the King re-confirmed her annuity.

12. THOMAS ASTLEY, Esq., of Nailstone, Leicestershire, Sheriff of Staffordshire, 3nd son but eldest surviving son and heir, born say 1415 (adult by 1437). He married MARGARET BOTELER, daughter of Thomas Boteler, Knt., by his wife, Elizabeth. They had two sons, William and Richard, Esq. In 1452 he was co-heir to his distant Shareshill cousin, Joan (Peshale) Lee, of Knightley (in Gnosall), Staffordshire, by which he inherited the manors of Patshull, Staffordshire, and Bolinghale, Shropshire. He was living at Easter 1457, when he was sued by his cousin, Robert Harcourt, Knt., in a plea of trespass. THOMAS ASTLEY, Esq., died in 1483, and was buried at Wolverhampton, Staffordshire. [Note: Margaret Boteler is presumably related to John Boteler of Eccleshale, Staffordshire, who served as an executor of her husband's grandfather, Thomas Astley's will in 1418 (see G. Wrottesley Staffordshire Suiti: Plua Rall: (Colls. Hist. Staffs. 17) (1896): 61). Presumably he is the same individual as John Boteler of Coventry, Warwickshire who served as a feoffee prior to 1413 for Thomas Astley, Esq. (see Cal. of Ancient Deedle—Series B 1 (List & Index Soc. 95) (1973): 47), or the John Boteler son of Thomas Boteler of Eccleshale by Coventry living 1425 (see Cal. of Ancient Deedle—Series B 1 (List & Index Soc. 95) (1973): 117). The Boteler family of Coventry is perhaps descended from an earlier Boteler family of Badminton, a cadet of the Wern line (see C.P. 12 Pt. 1 (1953): 418, footnote i (sub Suddery)).

13. RICHARD ASTLEY, Esq., of Patshull, Staffordshire, Nailstone and Little Stretton (in King's Norton), Leicestershire, and Baxterley, Warwickshire, Sheriff of Staffordshire, younger son, born say 1460. He was heir in or before 1497 to his older brother, William Astley. He married JOAN OTELEY, daughter of Thomas Oteley (or Ottley), Esq., of Pitchford, Shropshire, by Margaret, daughter of John Blount. They had three sons, Thomas, Hugh,

and Anthony, and three daughters, Elizabeth, Anne, and Jane. RICHARD ASTLEY, Esq., died shortly before 12 Nov. 1531, survived by his wife.
