# This is the last Will and Testament

of me Sophia Place of Webbington Castle in the County of Warwick widow & a  
give devise and bequeath unto my son William Henry Place and Lionel Place  
all my messuages lands tenements credits real and Personal Estate & Effects as  
witnesses and witnesses to hold to have their heirs executors administrators  
in equal shares and proportions as tenants in common and not as joint tenants  
and I appoint my said son joint Executors of this my will as in and to the  
In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand the twenty ninth day of  
October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty eight. Sophia  
Place - Signed by the said Sophia Place the testatrix in the presence of us  
present at the same time who have hereunto subscribed our names as in a  
witnesses = H. R. Harper = Rich<sup>d</sup>. Wood.

If Webbington Castle be sold & bequeath to my daughter Sophia Quantock  
3000 more than what she shall be entitled to after the death of us both the  
said son & I give to her the said Sophia Quantock my son in law witnesses my  
son = Sophia Place = Sarah Brown = Mary Ann Marshall = Aug<sup>5</sup><sup>th</sup> 1839.  
On the eighth day of October 1841.

**Appeared Personally** Richard Wood of Webbington in the  
County of Warwick Esquire and made oath that he is one of the subscribed  
witnesses to the last will and testament of Sophia Place late of Webbington Castle  
in the County of Warwick widow bearing date the twenty ninth day of  
October one thousand eight hundred and thirty eight now hereunto annexed  
and he further made oath that on the twenty ninth day of October aforesaid the  
said testatrix duly executed the said will by signing her name thereto in the  
presence of this deponent and of H. R. Harper the other subscribed witnesses  
and that both of whom were present at the same time and this deponent the  
said H. R. Harper thereupon attested and subscribed the said will in the pre-  
sence of the said testatrix and of said other = Richard Wood = same day the  
said Richard Wood was duly sworn to the truth of this affidavit by virtue of  
the annexed Commission = George William Sanford officiating Minister of the

the parish of Wixley in the County of York Spinster and made oath that she is  
one of the subscribed witnesses to the Codicil to the last will and testament of Sophia  
Place late of Webbington Castle in the County of Warwick widow bearing date the  
said Codicil bearing date the fifth day of August one thousand eight hundred and  
thirty nine now hereunto annexed and she further made oath that on the  
fifth day of August one thousand eight hundred and thirty nine aforesaid the  
said testatrix duly executed the said Codicil by signing her name thereto in the  
presence of this deponent and of Mary Ann Marshall Spinster the other  
subscribed witnesses thereto both of whom were present at the same time this  
deponent and the said Mary Ann Marshall thereupon attested and subscribed at  
the said Codicil in the presence of the said testatrix and of said other = Sarah Brown  
same day the said Sarah Brown was duly sworn to the truth of this affidavit  
by virtue of the annexed requisition before me = W<sup>m</sup>. Taylor Surrogate.

**Proved** at London with a Codicil 6<sup>th</sup> Nov<sup>r</sup> 1841 before the worshipful Mr. John  
Edmond Pratt Doctor of Laws & Surrogate by the oath of William Henry Place  
Esq<sup>r</sup> the son one of the executors to whom a power was granted according  
to the first proviso only to administer. Power reserved of making the like grant  
to Lionel Place the son also the other executor when he shall apply  
for the same.
